My Grandpa John Lougheed was born in Grey County, Ontario in 1878. Our Grandma Pearl Lougheed, nee Rogers was born near Thornbury Ontario, in 1886. Her Grandparents parents were United Empire Loyalists and came to Newmarket in 1800 taking up Lot 92 on Yonge St. from the crown.

After my grandparents married they moved to Edmonton Alberta. Grandpa had a team of mules and he worked building the railroad. They took a section of crown land near Edson, north-west of Edmonton to homestead. Their agreement with the crown was that they must stay on the land for at least six months of the year and cultivate it. In order to do that, they lived in a tent with four small children. My Dad was one of the four. They would move into Edmonton for the harsh prairie winter

Grandma told a story of being alone in the tent with her four children while Grandpa went to Edmonton with the team of mules to deliver grain. One night she heard a bear prowling outside the tent. She got the gun and went out and shot over the bear's head, scaring it away. What a brave woman!

Eventually, they traded that piece of land, sight unseen, for a farm on the 10<sup>th</sup> line of Nottawasaga Township, Ontario.

I am very proud of my pioneer grandparents and the role they played in making Canada such a great place in which to make a good life.
